

PERMANENT COLLECTION

SPANISH PAINTING 1100-1910 Arranged in chronological order, the Prado's Spanish painting collection ranges from 12th-century Romanesque murals to Sorolla's work from the early 20th century. Medieval, Renaissance and 19th-century paintings are displayed on the ground floor. The main floor holds works by El Greco, Ribera, Murillo, Velázquez and other Spanish Golden Age masters. This section culminates in the Goya collection, divided between the ground floor, first floor and south wing of the second floor.

FLEMISH PAINTING 1430-1700

Between the 15th and 17th centuries, the territory of modernday Belgium was an epicentre of pictorial production in Europe, rivalled only by Italy. The art created in that region is known as Flemish painting. The 15th and 16th-century collections— Wevden, Bosch, Patinir, Pieter Bruegel, etc.—are located on the ground floor, while the main and second floors house 17th-century Flemish painting, represented by Jan Brueghel, Rubens, Van Dyck, Jordaens and others.

ITALIAN PAINTING 1300-1800

The Italian painting section extends from the early Renaissance—Fra Angelico, Botticelli–to the 18th century-Tiepolo. Masterpieces by Raphael are among the highlights of the ground floor. The creations of the Venetian school—Titian. Tintoretto, Veronese and Bassanoconstitute one of the Prado's most compact collections. Works by Caravaggio and Gentileschi are also displayed on the main floor.

GERMAN PAINTING 1450-1800

Few in number but exceptional in guality, the works in the German painting collection range from the 16th to the 18th century. An entire room on the ground floor is given over to masterpieces by Albrecht Dürer, Lucas Cranach and Baldung Grien, while pictures by the neoclassical painter Anton Raphael Mengs are shown on the first and second floors.

DUTCH PAINTING 1579-1800 The Prado owns an important Rembrandt painting, as well as representative works by some of the leading painters of the Dutch school: Wtewael, De Bray, Stom, Metsu, Pieter Claesz, Willem Claesz.

SCULPTURE

Nearly two hundred and fifty sculptures grace the halls of the Prado: over one hundred classical sculptures, close to a dozen regal Renaissance portraits created by the Leoni family, and two carvings attributed to El Greco. Additionally the Museum boasts a small set of bronzes that Velázquez brought back from his second trip to Italy and a considerable number of 19th-century sculptures, including several outstanding examples of the neoclassical style.

FRENCH PAINTING 1600-1800

Spanish-French relations in the 17th century and the acquisitions made by monarchs like Philip IV and Philip V laid the foundations of the Prado's French painting collection, represented on the main floor by the work of Poussin and Claude l orrain

DRAWINGS AND PRINTS

The Museum houses nearly four thousand drawings. Particularly noteworthy is the collection of five hundred prints by Goya, the biggest in the world. Drawings and prints from the Prado's collection are shown periodically in the museum's exhibitions.

DECORATIVE ARTS

The 'Dauphin's Treasure', a collection of carved hardstone and rock crystal objects that belonged to Louis, Grand Dauphin of France and son of Louis XIV, and was inherited by his son, King Philip V of Spain, is exhibited in the north wing of the second floor. Additionally, *pietre dure* tables and consoles made in Florence and Madrid between the 16th and 18th centuries, glazed ceramic wares and other decorative items are distributed throughout various rooms
